Military Suicide Pandemic

During the first six months of 2020, overall military suicides have increased by as much as 20 percent. Among the services, the Army and Marines have suffered the highest numbers of suicide,

As a ministry we have seen first hand the effects that this pandemic and response to it has had on our clients. When the stay at home orders shuttered

our nations churches and counselling centers, we kept our doors open. By doing so, we've been able to provide greater levels of Christ centered counselling and care to a greater number of veterans and their family members.

Financially, it has been challenging, but our ability to remain open and serving is directly related to having God's support, and the support of Churches and our many friends and supporters of the mission or care of LMVFM to our veterans and their families.

In some way, every American has been negatively affected by the almost overnight virus-related forced isolation, financial disruptions, remote schooling and loss of child care. And the stress that all of us have felt has been magnified among our troops and their family members who also struggle with war-zone deployments, national disasters and civil unrest as evidenced by the sharp rise murders and other violent behaviour.

I am so glad you wrote to me! I know it's tough buddy. While I can't get your mommy home quicker there are some things you can do to help until she gets back.

First, ask Dad to put monthly calendars on the refrigerator. At night, before you say your prayers and go to bed, put a big X in the square for that day. Every X means you are one day closer to when your mom comes home.

Next, keep a notebook – your own special "Deployment Diary", to give Mom when she returns. Every day, you write something about the day to share with your mom. Write a note, draw a picture, include a photo. Your mom misses you too and will love seeing pictures of what you've been doing while she's been away.

Soldiers love getting hand written letters, especially from their kids. So be sure to write your mom a lot and call her whenever Dad says it's okay. It can get pretty lonely when you're deployed, so your letters will really help your mom until she get's back home to you and your dad.
