Army Tells Soldiers to Get Help From Friends and Family for Mental Health Issues

The headline above seems to be appropriate, if not obvious advice at first glance. But as we dig deeper into the nature of this recommendation from the US Army's annual meeting we see a different picture.

At the same time, the Army announced plans to cut medical staff. Amidst fears from soldiers and their families, the service claims that such cuts will not reduce access to care.

Army leadership acknowledges a shortage of mental health providers and tells troops to get help from family and friends. While family and friends can often help temporarily with certain mental health issues, the reality is that many are either not equipped to help, or as need of healthcare themselves. Although

the service is working to increase the number of behavioral health providers available to personnel, it is important to reach out to other resources such as your family, your friends, your golf buddies, your running partners, or LMVFM.

It is concerning that cuts are made, followed by promises of continuing levels of access to care. Meanwhile, the Army suggests seeking help elsewhere. LMVFM provides that help and remains a resource our veterans can count on.











What's in a Name?

During a recent trip, the LMVFM Team encountered a situation that confirms there is still a lot of work to be done to educate many of our fellow Americans about what defines a veteran. Over an otherwise peaceful breakfast meal in a quaint little restaurant, we overheard a man at a nearby table proclaim to a couple of guys at his table that "Bill" (a mutual friend of theirs) was not a veteran because he was "just in the National Guard, you know, a weekend warrior." Unfortunately, the man was just one of too many people we encounter that share a serious misconception: that serving in the National Guard or Army Reserve does not count as real military service, or qualify a person as being a veteran.

It is tough to listen to such statements and not take offense when you know that:

- In 2020, the National Guard activated more troops for duty than any time since World War II, as the U.S. dealt with the COVID-19 pandemic, wildfires and civil unrest.
- Tens of thousands of Guardsmen logged 8.4 million duty days in the last year, mobilizing in all 50 states, 3 territories, and Washington D.C. A majority of those efforts were related to the pandemic.
- The National Guard is comprised of 440,000 soldiers and aviators, and during the twenty years since 9/11 have become a seamless part of U.S. military missions.
- 39% of the Army's operational forces come from the National Guard.
- 30% of the Air Force's operational forces come from the Air National Guard.
- Over 4,000 Guard and Reserve troops have been deployed to the US-Mexico border in 2022, and 8 have died during their deployments.

Our supporters may have a mental picture that LMVFM's outreach efforts involve leading discussions in a church fellowship hall, or a women's quilting group - and those pictures are indeed accurate. But now and again God gives us opportunities to make a personal impact with an audience of one. We trust that all of these conversations, large and small, are done with His blessing. We hope that they have a long term positive impact similar to those that Jesus Christ engaged in, whether He gave a sermon on a hill, or spoke with a single woman at Jacob's Well. Because of our faithful supporters, we can continue having these conversations!
